Families and children will face enough challenges this year as they return to the classrooms without having to worry about school supplies. I know that many are eager to get back in class. Yet there will be challenges. Let's make this somewhat easier for them by providing all the school supplies possible. The uncertainty of the virus, the rise in the number of cases, and the circulation of so much information and disinformation are creating great uncertainty in life. Ephesians 2:11-18  
July 19, 2020

Ephesians is one of the richest books in the New Testament.

Paul seeks to build a doctrinal foundation on their redemption and then illustrates that by showing how that affects us.

On the doctrinal foundation of redemption, Paul builds the case for reconciliation between God and man.

The need for reconciliation fills our culture today.

Paul assists us in understanding how to apply reconciliation in our lives.

**Remember** our posture **before** God (Vs. 11-12)

- We were without Christ.
- We were aliens.
- We were strangers.
- We were without hope.
- We were without God.

**Remember** our position **in** Christ. (Vs. 13)

- We are accepted.
- We are blessed.
- We are chosen.
- We are delivered.
- We are enriched.

Reconciliation seeks to restore fellowship between two parties who have been separated. Christ has made that possible through His death.
